RE's Report

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of those who helped make our May race, the Al Fairer SARRC/MARRS Challenge, a resounding success! Apparently our switch to a 2-day format, from its previous 3-day format, was well received as we had the largest turnout in some time with well over 300 cars entered. This high car count was a mixed blessing however. All these cars/drivers put quite a strain on our Registration, Timing & Scoring, and Pit & Grid staff. Through dedication, sweat, tears, and perseverance, these volunteers met the challenge and kept everything moving smoothly with only a few glitches. I noted many on line thanks to our Registrar, Ginny Condrey. As registrar, Ginny is responsible for much of the behind-the-scenes logistics including tracking the entries and providing that information to the Race Chair and Stewards so they can make informed decisions regarding race groups. For this particular race, she went out of her way to keep the competitors of impending group changes, via email messages, so that folks would not be surprised when they arrived at the track. Way to go Ginny!

I think we may have set some kind of a record by hosting a group exclusively of 90 Miatas for Saturday's Group 5 race (if anyone knows of a larger Miata race, please let me know!). While numbers were high, as a driver I can say that there was plenty of room to race and metal-to-metal seemed to be relatively minor (although there were quite a few off course excursions). The Group 1 race was almost as large both Saturday and Sunday with over 80 cars participating in those races. Turnout for the open wheel classes was disappointing with only 14 in one group and just over 20 in the other. Based on the large turnout in some groups, the light turnout in others, and comments received, there will likely be discussions of recombining some of the groups to better balance the numbers.

One other aspect of this event that will receive some serious discussion in the coming months is the 2-day versus 3-day format. The Region switched to a 2-day format based on comments from drivers who could not afford to take off an additional day from work, the ever increasing cost to rent the track, and surplus time that was observed last year. Based on the increased driver turnout this year, it appears obvious that the drivers vastly prefer the 2-day format. However, the MARRS competition board has indicated that they will not support this event as a MARRS event in the future unless the event returns to the 3-day format. This may leave our Region faced with a decision between a reduction in participation due to switching to a less desirable 3-day format or a reduction in participation since the event would no longer count towards the MARRS driver's end of year championship. Since it appears your BOD will be faced with a lose-lose situation, we sure could use your input in making a final decision on the format as we establish the race schedule for next year. Please feel free to share your thoughts and preferences with your chapter rep or anyone on the BOD or Comp Board. We will need to get input prior to June's BOD meeting as the Region needs to have a race schedule in place prior to the SEDiv Mid-year meeting in July.

Speaking of race schedules, the Region is hard at work putting together the remaining track event schedule for next year. VIR has confirmed their support for a double National race next year and has indicated we may be able to get our March race date back. Based on a very productive meeting between VIR Track Manager, Josh Leif, and NCR representatives, we have a much better idea of each other's goals and how we can work together to achieve those

goals. One of NCR's primary goals is to solidify our race dates at VIR and our BOD Secretary Jerry Pell asked the question that was on everyone's mind – "what can our region do to move ourselves up the "pecking order" for race dates. Josh explained that one of his primary responsibilities is to insure that the track is sustainable financially and anything the region could do to increase the track's revenue from any given event would improve the Region's bargaining position. While this was not a great surprise to many of us, what did surprise us were the revenue sources that he considers. These include not only the track rental but also revenue generated by test days before the event, the track hotel rooms, garages, race shop, Oak Tree Tavern, Pagoda grill, go-cart track, and pretty much everything else inside the track! Based on that enlightenment, our Region needs to do what it can, collectively and individually, to better utilize these aspects of VIR. We also noted that the track needed to do a better job of "selling" themselves since few of us knew much about the tavern or that the race shop is now much more racer oriented (brake pads and fuel lines have replace the embroidered shirts). So next time you're at the track wondering where to eat that night, please consider the Oak Tree Tavern. The food is great, the prices reasonable, and you just might be helping out our Region!

If we do get the March date back at VIR, then all of our traditional race dates will take place at VIR and racing at Rockingham becomes an option for the Region. Based on the positive response from the drivers following this year's March race at Rockingham, the BOD supports hosting at least one race weekend there each year. Consequently, we will need input on what kind of event you would like to see. Options include a regional race such as a CCPS supported by other events such as a PDX or Time Trial. What would you like to see at Rockingham? Just let us know your thoughts.

Since we're on the subject of Rockingham, please, please remember to spread the word about the upcoming Performance Driving Experience (PDX/HPDE) coming up September 8-9 at Rockingham. We need a good turnout of students, instructors, and workers at this event if the region is to consider continuing these types of events. The fun per dollar of these events can't be beat so there is no reason why they should not be successful.

The next club race will be our Region's one and only National race which takes place August 11-12 at VIR. This year will include a double CCPS race so there will be ample opportunities for both National and Regional drivers and plenty of action both days. If you can't race, we would love for you to come out and help in one of the specialties. Since this is our Region's National race, we would love to put our best foot forward and stuff the corner stations with lots of smiling faces! All of the Region's races are spectator events, so if we can't convince you to work, come up to watch and bring your friends!

That's it for June, so check the events calendar and come on out and as always, have fun out there!

West Chapter Notes

For our May 2007 meeting in Greensboro we had Kurt Roehrig of Roehrig Engineering give us a PowerPoint presentation about shock absorbers, their function and how they work, and how they are typically tested. Mr. Roehrig's company manufactures Shock Dynamometers, from simple to high tech, and sells this equipment to most shock absorber manufacturers around the world, as well as automobile manufacturers, professional race teams, including those in NASCAR, ChampCar, IRL, etc.

After the presentation, Kurt had a question and answer session, as well as shock demos (shocks with clear bodies so that you can see what happens in the shock during compression and rebound). The Q&A session was interesting as the discussions had to do with suspensions.

He also briefly shared his previous racing experience, which includes being an engineer for the BMW GTP cars during the 1980's in IMSA (competing against the team I worked for at the time, Holbert Racing) as well as campaigning his own cars. He currently campaigns a car in the IMSA Lites series.

For such a good presentation, I was disappointed in the turnout: 20 attendees. We had a few new faces in the group that are current members, but had not made it out to the meetings previously. Welcome to y'all and I hope you can make it to our future meetings!

Dave Lumpkin, Rally Master, gave the results from the Foothills Frolic Rally held in April. A local driver/navigator team, Heather Powers and Lisa Masquat, won the Stock class. Several club racers decided to join the fun to see what this side of the SCCA was all about, and I don't believe they were disappointed. I helped work the event, which involved timing cars at check points, and driving an alternate route from the competitors to get to the next check point. The rally route went from Greensboro to the Hanging Rock State Park area, with several challenging, hilly roads. Dave received many compliments on the race route.

We also just finished the Al Fairer SARRC/MARRS Double Regional races recently at VIR; on Saturday alone there were 343 cars in seven groups taking the green flag. Most returned on Sunday to take the green flag as well. One group was for Miatas only, with 90 competitors! I had been told that on some online forums there were complaints about the large fields; it seems these drivers had never entered our ECR or Carolina Cup endurance events at VIR which have from 90 to 100 cars in the race! Or our 13 Hour Kumho Charge of the Headlight Brigade endurance event, which tops out at 80 cars.

Kudos to our volunteer workers: flaggers, pit & grid, tech, timing & scoring, race control, EV, pace car drivers, paddock marshalls and stewards (did I forget anyone?) for putting on a great event.

There is a bit of a break until our next NCR event, the Oak Tree National in August at VIR, I hope to see you at VIR for this event, and hope to see you at our local meeting on the first Tuesday of the month in Greensboro.

Minutes from monthly Board Meeting April 18, 2007

Present: Mark Senior, RE, Rex and Patricia Deffenbaugh, Heather Powers, Buddy Matthews, Joedy Pennington, Bruce Dover, Scott Gallimore, Blair Stitt, Ginny Condrey, Jerry Pell, John Uftring, Ed Wentz, and via telephone for parts of the meeting, Richard Franklin and Sara Snider.

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mark Senior, RE.
2. The RE recognized guests: Patricia Deffenbaugh, John Uftring and Bruce Dover.
3. Motion (Pennington/Snider) to approve the Minutes of the March 21, 2007, Board of Directors meeting, with corrections as to the correct spelling of the last name of Dave Lumkin and to correct the date referenced in paragraph 2.C., "Budget and Finance Committee", from 2008 to 2007; Passed.

Reports:

1. Chapter Reports.

A. Cape Fear Chapter/SOLO Program: Richard Franklin, Chapter Coordinator, reported that 10 members attended their last Chapter meeting. He advised that the Autocross event scheduled for April 15, 2007, at the New River Air Station was cancelled due to inclement weather, but it has been rescheduled for April 29, 2007, at the same location. Richard advised that 12 of his Chapter's members were disappointed that the PDX event at Rockingham (April 21 & 22, 2007) had been cancelled. The advertisement flier for the "MayDay on the Runway" SOLO event, scheduled for May 20, 2007, at the North Carolina Global Transpark in Kinston, North Carolina, was presented.

B. West Chapter: Ed Wentz, Chapter Coordinator, reported that 18 people attended the last Chapter Meeting, including a visiting Wayne Quick. The Chapter discussed upcoming events, including the Foothills Frolic Rally, to be held April 14, 2007, and that a specific request was made, at the meeting, for workers to help with the Rally. Ed advises that 11 teams participated in the April 14th Rally which began in Greensboro and went to Hanging Rock State Park and then returned to Greensboro. A copy of the results and a report as to the Rally, event is attached to these Minutes. Mr. Kurt Roehrig will be the guest speaker at May's West Chapter meeting, and he will give a presentation regarding racing shock absorbers. Ed further reported that the West Chapter meeting discussed the then upcoming PDX/TT event scheduled for Rockingham on the 21st and 22nd of April, 2007. Following Ed's remarks, the Board entered into a lengthy discussion of the reasons why the PDX/TT event, scheduled for Rockingham for the 21st and 22nd had to be cancelled. The issues and challenges facing the Region in putting on PDX events, including the failure to attract a sufficient number of PDX participants to cover even one third of the basic costs of the event was discussed. John Uftring offered his perspective as to why other sanctioning groups seemed to be able to attract sufficient number of entries to justify (number wise) PDX type events. The Board recognized that most SCCA road racers do not typically have a large interest in PDX type events and that the number of SCCA autocrossers is relatively small, (compared to other dedicated to autocross groups), to which groups PDX type events offer a great attraction. The Board concluded that hypothetically a minimum of 45 cars at \$200 per car is needed to break even at a 2 day PDX event at Rockingham (North Carolina Motor Speedway). Motion (Deffenbaugh/Pennington) that the presently scheduled PDX event at Rockingham, on the Region's calendar for September 8 & 9, 2007, remain on the schedule and be conducted as a standalone 2 day PDX event; Passed.

C. Triangle Chapter. Blair Stitt, Chapter Coordinator, reported that 20 people attended the last Triangle Chapter meeting wherein, among other things, the Chapter viewed a video of the Rockingham Race held in March of this year. The Chapter indicated the need for a map, to be provided at Registration, of the paddock area(s) at Rockingham, to help those not familiar with the available parking areas at Rockingham. The Chapter also suggested that a voluntary contribution container soliciting contributions to the NCR's worker fund be placed at Registration for our events.

2. Committee Reports.

- A. Advertising: No report.
- B. Banquet Committee: The Committee indicated it had received no indication that any other City had been recommended for the banquet to be held in 2008. Motion (Stitt/Pennington) to keep the annual banquet for 2007 (January, 2008) in Raleigh; Passed.
- C. Budget and Finance Committee: Motion (Pennington/Gallimore) that entry fees per race (per sanction

number), from this point forward, be increased at least \$15 per entry, \$10 of which is to go to the general account of the Region and \$5 is to go to the workers fund; Passed. Motion (Pennington/Gallimore) to discuss with the CCPS representatives the reasons as to lowering the fee paid by the Region to Carolina Cup Pro Series, currently at \$75 per entry per race, and/or raising the entry fee, per entry per race, for future CCPS race events; Passed. Blair Stitt agreed to serve as the 2nd NCR representative to the CCPS Committee, with David Murphy, our Region's other CCPS representative.

D. Charities Committee: Blair passed out fliers for the Race For Angels, scheduled for May 12 & 13, 2007, at VIR, being the Al Fairer SARRC/MARRS Challenge. Each flier includes a pass entitling the holder to an entry to VIR during the race weekend.

3. Finance

A. Treasurer's Report: Sara Snider reported as to the Profit and Loss statement for the Region, for the period March 22 – April 10, 2007, which report includes a Balance Sheet, as of April 10, 2007, a copy of which Profit and Loss statement and Balance Sheet is attached to these Minutes. Sara advises that the P&L statement reflects some income related to the upcoming SARRC/MARRS event in May, 2007. She further reports that the March Memories race at Rockingham resulted in an approximate \$1,200 loss. Further, she reports that the SOLO/Spring Fling event netted (profit) approximately \$682. This information is reflected on the Profit and Loss by Class statement attached to the Minutes, which covers the period January 1, through April 10, 2007, reflecting the March Memories and Spring Fling events. Ginny advises that the January 1 through April 10th Profit and Loss by Class statement, reflects an expense of \$1,000, which really was a racetrack deposit paid in 2006, but which expense relates to the March (2007) Memories Race.

Old Business:

1. Operations Manual. The Board decided to give further consideration to the draft of the Operations Manual at the next Board of Directors meeting; a draft of the manual, which was provided to the Board Members, contains the latest version of the manual, including the recent suggestions and corrections provided by Mark Senior and Scott Gallimore.
2. PDX/Club Trial Event. No further discussion.
3. Meeting location. The consensus of the Board is to move the monthly Board of Directors Meeting place, beginning next month, to the restaurant previously suggested by Mark, and located east of the present location, even if that restaurant cannot provide us with a phone line for conference calls. Mark will check on the issue of the closing hour of the proposed restaurant, to see if they can accommodate our meeting if it extends beyond 9:00 P.M., which it typically does.

New Business:

1. Mark provided additional information as to the Florida group's efforts to establish a new race series for lengthy (12+ hours) enduro races, such as our Region's 13 hour enduro event. Mark provided the Board of Directors with a copy of a document entitled "Kumho Endurance Championship Series", which outlines the proposed series, the races to be involved, the classes of cars to be permitted to enter the races and the scoring system proposed.
2. RE Announcement. Mark advised the Board of Directors that he will not seek re-election as the RE when his term expires at the end of 2007.

Motion (Pell/Powers) to adjourn the meeting at 10:05 P.M.; Passed.
