It's been a long and difficult 2½ months for me since working the start stand for the Rolex 24 at Daytona and I desperately needed to get away for a weekend of fun, sun, and relaxation. With that said, I drove myself down to the sunny west coast of Florida to work the American Le Mans Series Acura Sports Car Challenge, part of the IndyCar Honda Grand Prix of St. Petersburg weekend. I had never worked a street course before, so this made it more of a reason to be a part of this event. I had a lot of fun for the 2 days that I was there and I was impressed with everything from the layout of the circuit and the challenge that it brings for the drivers (part airport runway, part city streets), but of everything that there was to do during my downtime and how easy it was to get to it all. Plus, it helped to have Tampa Bay and all the boats on the water as a breathtaking backdrop.

This event was very unique for me since, not only was I working my first street race, but this was the first time that I registered and worked directly through IMSA as a Starter and they took very good care of me and my needs throughout the event. I only worked Friday and Saturday and my responsibilities were to provide communication via the SCCA net and backup to IMSA Chief Starter, Dennis Paul, and his backup, Bob Kosky. I had worked with Dennis before at last year's Petit Le Mans but this was my first time working with Bob and I had a great time working with both of them. They gave me some "on point" time during Friday's ALMS 2nd practice and the Morning Warm-Up session (which sadly only lasted one lap due to IRL time constraints and an incident with one of the Dyson Lolas), and helped me further my blue flagging skills. I also got to work with Simone from IMSA race control again and, as was the case at Petit Le Mans, she was one of the best I've ever listen to on the radio. During my downtime (I was not needed for the IRL portion of the weekend), I spent most of my time either walking the circuit and partaking in many of the event's festivities (including both ALMS and IRL autograph sessions), or sharing some old racing stories (as well as some great food) with the IMSA officials in the Hospitality tent. We started 17 cars on Saturday (the smallest field in ALMS history with no GT1 cars) and after 1 Hour and 55 Minutes of racing, 93 laps (167.4 miles), and only 1 full-course caution (caused by the #11 Dodge Viper GT2 car), we had 12 cars running at the finish with the Acura of Scott Sharp and David Brabham taking the overall victory in LMP1, Adrian Fernandez and Luis Diaz winning for Acura in LMP2 (finishing 2nd overall and the only car on the same lap), and The Flying Lizard Porsche of Patrick Long and Jorg Bergmeister taking GT2 honors (finishing 5th overall).

I came away from the streets of St. Petersburg with some great memories. I sadly didn't get to see any of my SCCA friends while I was there but I made a few new ones on the IMSA side and saw an old high school friend for the first time in 18 years. I'll remember the view of Tampa Bay from the start stand and the air shows that flew over the circuit. After surviving a tough winter, it was nice to be back at the track again.

# **NCR Board Meeting Summary, February 25, 2009**

Present: Steve Keadle, Wayne Quick, Buddy Matthews, Ron Gentry, James Shanks, Rex Deffenbaugh, Blair Stitt, Joedy Pennington, Heather Powers, John Uftring, Jerry Pell, Bruce Dover, Glenn Long, RE, Ed Wentz, Ginny Condrey, John Lindquist, Alana Long, and, via telephone, Brad Draughon.

1. The meeting was called to order by Glenn Long, RE, at 7:34 p.m. at “The Cutting Board” in Burlington, NC.
2. Motion (Shanks/Gentry) to approve the minutes of the December 17, 2008, Board of Directors (“BoD”) Meeting; Passed.

## **FINANCIAL REPORTS**

1. Treasure’s Report: Steve Keadle, Treasurer, reported that he would be including financial information on the Region’s website to comply with the IRS rules as to financial disclosures by “not for profit” entities, which is the IRS status as to the North Carolina Region. Further, he reports that BB&T is our Region’s new bank; the Region formally used Wachovia but, from a logistics point of view, BB&T is more convenient to Ginny. The Board then discussed 2009 budget update issues regarding possible amendments to the 2009 budgets for EV and for the Bulletin. A proposed increase of the EV budget to \$1,845.00 from \$1,000.00 was discussed, as well as an additional \$1,550.00 for the Bulletin’s 2009 budget, above its initial 2009 budget of \$5,200.00. On a month to month basis, the Region’s actual expenditures in January, 2009, were less than budgeted, but some of January’s expenses will be reflected in February’s disbursements. A copy of a Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual, for January, 2009, is attached to these minutes. The BoD discussed the initial budgets, as set, and the suggested increases to the budgets of EV and the Bulletin. The Treasurer gave his opinion as to the fixed costs included in the Bulletin’s 2009 budget, and the reason for increasing the initial budget, for same, as originally set, i.e., \$5,200.00 plus an increase of \$1,550.00, equals \$6,750.00.
2. Motion (Pell/Matthews) that the 2009 budget for the Bulletin be increased by the requested \$1,550.00, to \$6,750.00, to correct the initial budget error, which left out said amount (\$1,550.00); Passed.
3. The BoD then considered the EV budget issue, which initially was set at \$1,000.00 (for 2009), but which amount has been requested to be increased by approximately \$845.00. The BoD decided to defer further action on this matter until information can be presented to the BoD as to EV’s budget and requested increase.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

1. SEDIV Meeting Review: It was reported that no 2009 SEDIV racing schedule conflicts arose and no changes to the 2009 SEDIV race schedule was made during the SEDIV Meeting; no SARRC or ECR rules were significantly changed. Further, the SEDIV reduced its budget by 15% overall. One rule change made was that to qualify for the 2009 SIC race event, one needed only 3 SARRC starts – not 3 SARRC finishes, to enter for the year end SIC race event. Steward training was also a large part of the SEDIV meeting this year.
2. National Convention Review. The RE, and others attending the National SCCA Convention, reported as to: SCCA National’s use of membership input as to expediting the registration processes; the Quad Four discussion; The Spec Miata Compliance Fee discussion; that SCCA Pro, SCCA Enterprises and SCCA National each showed a profit in 2008, from operations, but that SCCA National lost money on its investments; further, SCCA Enterprises is beginning to build some parts for the Spec Racer Ford and Spec Miata classes; each Division now has some special tools to enforce Spec Miata rules; the Spec Miata Compliance Council has increased significantly, their being a large interest to increasing inspections of Spec Miatas. Ron Gentry reported on the open forum for Pro Racing and that Pro Racing acknowledged that it made money and has repaid, in 2008, some part of its bank loans, and also paid back, last year, some part of the SCCA loans made to Pro Racing.
3. Year End NCR Survey: Alana Long gave the BoD an overview of the results of the NCR membership survey, a copy of the results are attached to these minutes. The RE requested that the members of the BoD review the survey results, and the comments, and return with some suggestions as to constructive responses to the issues highlighted by the survey.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

1. Vacant Member at Large position: There is a now vacant Member At Large position, arising from the election of Heather Powers, a Member At Large, to the position of Assistant RE. Four NCR members expressed a desire to fill the now vacant Member At Large position, the four being Wayne Quick, Joedy Pennington, John Lindquist, and Rex Deffenbaugh. Each of these four candidates gave the BoD an oral presentation of their qualifications and reasons as to why they would be an asset to the BoD and the Region, as one of its Members At Large. The BoD elected John Lindquist as the Member At Large to fill the position formally held by Heather Powers; the BoD expressed its appreciation to the other three candidates for their interest in serving, by filling the open Member At Large position, and their participation in the selection process.
2. Jeff Joyce, a NCR member, lost his wife, Katie Joyce, the week prior to this BoD meeting; the BoD then discussed an appropriate acknowledgement of his loss. In addition to our member Jeff Joyce, the deceased is survived by a minor son, Jacob. The BoD voted to dedicate all the proceeds from the charity event at the upcoming NCR March Memories race at VIR to "The Joyce Fund", in honor of the memory of Katie Joyce.
3. Registration: The BoD discussed opening up online registration prior to the receipt of race sanction numbers from SCCA. The pros and cons of this issue were considered and the BoD agreed that the RE and Ginny should look into this matter with the view of permitting "early" registration to accommodate racers who want to register early for one or more of the Region's race events.
4. Feedback Form: The BoD discussed the idea of having a form at all NCR events, available to participants, to permit each participant to give the Region their feedback about said event. Alana Long agreed to attempt to create a feedback form to be given to drivers, corner and other workers, specialty chiefs, etc., and others attending the Region's events.
5. New Workers: The BoD discussed methods of encouragement of younger (new) workers (volunteers). This discussion includes the development of a program to encourage Non-Racing drivers (auto cross and PDX drivers) to attend NCR Regional and National race events as a "new" worker. James Shanks made a suggestion as to creating a "group" experience for said new workers attending a NCR race event.
6. Chapter Raffles: The RE ask each Chapter Coordinator to explore at their Chapter meetings the Chapter's desire to participate in a 50/50 raffle, with all proceeds going back to the Region, above the raffle winner's share. The Chapter Coordinators will ask their Chapter members to consider the desirability of this raffle idea.

## **REPORTS:**

### 1. Chapters:

A- Cape Fear: Brad Draughon, Chapter Coordinator, reports that the previous Cape Fear Chapter meeting was held at the National Speed Shop, and that 26 members attended. He also reported that 70 cars were registered at last weekend's solo (autocross) event. He further discussed the Annual banquet last held in Wilmington and their Chapter's desire to host it again next year. He advised that there is a solo event scheduled for Raleigh this spring.

B- Triangle Chapter: James Shanks, Chapter Coordinator, advises that the Triangle Chapter will be providing workers for the autocross event to be held in Raleigh. Thirty people attended the last Triangle Chapter meeting. James advised the Chapter members of a new Enduro series in the Southeast. The RE described to the BoD this new Enduro series, which is based upon each team's results from the three enduro race events held in the Carolinas, involving three SCCA regions. The primary sponsor for the new series is Long Road Racing. One of the three enduro events is our Region's 13 hour enduro event, held at VIR, the "Charge Of The Headlight Brigade".

C- West Chapter: Ed Wentz, Chapter Coordinator, reported that 13 members attended the last West Chapter meeting; the attendance was substantially reduced because of the snow that fell that evening. Ed advised that the Chapters members talked about the Annual Banquet held in Wilmington in January, and also discussed the Region's budget for 2009, and the concerns of the Region's BoD, and others, that a reduction of approximately 15% in the Region's gross revenue is anticipated, in view of the economy.

## 2. Committees:

A- Banquet: Brad Draughon reports that in 2010 the Annual Banquet will again be held in Wilmington and hosted by the Cape Fear Chapter.

B- Competition Board: The Competition Board held a meeting in February, 2009, and at the meeting prepared the balance of the Supplemental Regulations for the year, by working on the language of same, to be included in the Supplemental Regulations for all 2009 NCR race events. The Chairman of the Competition Board, Heather Powers, the Region's Assistant RE, reported as to her meeting with Mr. Rick Moser, NCR EV Chief. The Competition Board discussed the DC Region's suggestions as to Chiefs and Stewards for the AI Fairer SARRC/MARRS Challenge event to be held in May. It is anticipated that all the race groups in the May event will be between 60 to 70 cars each. The SEDIV will provide the Chief Steward for the event and the DC Region will provide the SOM. Heather reported as to her discussions with the President of the Triad Sports Car Club. Heather also advises that she intends to talk with the Triad Sports Car Club about attending the Region's solo (auto cross) event, to be held in Raleigh. Heather also discussed the "Street Smart Program" now being headed up by Kaye Fairer. Heather also advised that a Formula SAE event will again, as last year, be held at VIR in April, the weekend after our Double National and Trans Am event is held in April at VIR. With reference to the joint efforts of the DC Region and the NC Region as to the AI Fairer SARRC/MARRS Challenge event, the RE advises that we (NCR) intend to use co-specialty Chiefs from the NCR and the DCR where possible during said event.

C. Solo: It was reported that the Region's first autocross event this year, the "Spring Fling" held at UNCW, had 70 entries. On April 5, 2009, at NC State University in Raleigh, the Region will be holding a solo (auto cross) event.

D. PDX/TT No additional information.

E. Publicity: John Uftring, Publicity Chairman, reported as to some advertisements he has placed for the Double National at VIR and provided to the BoD information which is being made available on the Region's web site as to the Region's Solo (autocross) events and the Region's PDX events to be held this year.

F. Membership: James Shanks advises that the Region now has approximately 829 members, a 5% decrease from this period in 2008.

Motion to adjourn at 9:50 p.m.; Passed.
